#### **INCREASING OUR SERVICES**

We continue to grow our services and increase the number of people we support.

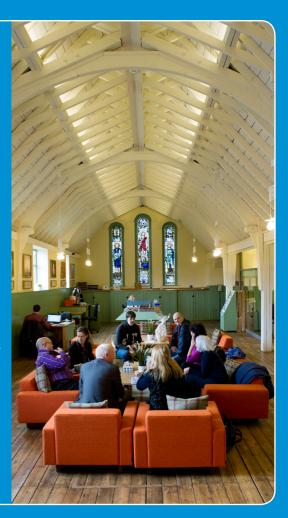
Over the past six months we have seen a large increase in the number of people accessing our services, and this has enabled us to support more people.

A breakdown of the figures shows:

- 33% more people are accessing our complementary therapy service
- 40% more are accessing our counselling service
- 45% more men are using our services
- 48% more people are getting support in the Calman Centre

To enable us to meet the growing demand of people who suffer the painful side-effects of chemotherapy, we are delighted to have doubled the number of chiropody appointments. They are now available from 09:00 – 16:15 on Mondays & Wednesdays, and from 09:00 – 13:00 on Tuesdays.

Our chiropody service is available to anyone diagnosed with cancer and who is suffering from the effects chemotherapy has on their feet and nails.



## CANCER SUPPORT SCOTLAND'S COMPLEMENTARY THERAPY SERVICES ARRIVES AT CAMPBELTOWN

#### PILOT PROGRAMME

Do you have lymphoedema, and can you commit to six weekly, 60 minute appointments from 09:45? Would you like to take part in our 'Reflexology Lymphoedema' pilot?

### Are you, or is someone you know affected by lymphoedema?

Our Calman Centre complementary therapists, Rachel and Elspeth, have recently trained in Sally Kay BSc (Hons) method of reflexology lymph drainage.

They are running a pilot study into the effects of Reflexology lymph drainage on clients affected with secondary lymphoedema in one arm following breast cancer treatment. They are looking for participants to take part, who can commit to attending the centre for six consecutive weeks on the same day and time each week.

#### What is lymphoedema?

Lymphoedema is defined as tissue swelling due to the failure of lymph drainage. The failure of

lymph drainage can be due to the lymphatic system being compromised due to some or all lymph nodes in an area being removed as part of cancer treatment or damage being caused by radiotherapy or other cancer treatments.

#### What is Reflexology lymph drainage?

RLD is an award winning reflexology technique which focuses on stimulating the lymphatic reflexes on the feet. The aim is to cause an effect on the lymphatic system in the body. It is a unique sequence that has been researched and developed by Sally Kay BSc (Hons) while working in cancer care. The results appear to support the theory of reflexology.

#### **BEAUTY CARE**

Hi everyone. The last time I was going to write about all the great stuff **Defiant Beauty** has to keep you cool during the hot weather, the weather broke and the rain and cold weather came back with a vengeance. If this happens again I hope you don't hold me responsible! At least just now, the rain is a bit warmer and the thunder is breaking the humidity.

At the Calman Centre, we have some great products to help you stay cool when you feel like you are about to melt into a greasy blob.

First off, we have a lovely, refreshing **Cool and Refresh Spritz**. It's a fantastic spray that can cool you down as it dries into your skin. It might also help if you, like me, find the heat in hospitals unbearable. It's the most wonderful feeling when you spray it onto your face and body and its cooling effect is so immediate.

We also have a **Mild Mint Foot Balm** which is so satisfyingly cool when your feet are too hot and swollen. You only need to use a small amount of balm as you can always add

The Cool and Refresh Spritz is £20 for a 100g spray and the Foot Balm is £17.50 for 50g. The products may seem a tad expensive but the ingredients are as pure as it is possible to get and they are presented in glass jars.

I would like to mention if you already have some Defiant Beauty products, you could find the balms melting in their jars. This is not a problem. They melt because of the shea, coconut and cocoa butters in them. If you keep them somewhere cool they will solidify again. The products will not "go off" because of this process. #### A VERY LUCKY MAN

In September 2013, I attended The Beatson for a course of treatment for bowel cancer. I received chemotherapy and radiotherapy each day for a period of five weeks.

As my home is some ninety miles by road from Glasgow, it was not feasible for me to travel to the hospital daily. Rather than take up a hospital bed, I was fortunate to be accommodated at the Pond Hotel.

So I found myself a long way from home, not feeling great and more than just a bit worried about my future.

Then I found my way to The Calman Centre...

To have such a marvellous, tranquil place to go to each day away from the hospital environment was absolutely tremendous. The friendly welcome I received immediately was reassuring and actually a little overwhelming. I took full advantage of the complementary therapies, (I think my wife was a little jealous when I phoned her each day to report my day's experiences), and if I just wanted a cup of coffee and to sit and read the newspaper, The Calman Centre was there for me.

In January 2014 I underwent successful surgery to remove my now much shrunken tumour.

So eighteen months since my treatment, life has been a bit challenging but now I am back on track. I have a new job as a part-time administrator with a charitable project in Tighnabruaich, close to my home, I am planning a holiday to the Algarve and life is good.

I am sure my visits to The Calman Centre and the support I received from Cancer Support Scotland have played a major part in my recovery, and I will not forget the kindness and support shown to me by everyone I met.

# Cancer Support Scotland AGM & Conference

# Cancer Support Scotland Conference 2015

This half day conference will focus on the needs of people affected by cancer and this year's theme is "politics to care"

#### Who should attend?

## **BACKGROUND ON GUEST SPEAKERS**

**Speaker 1 – TBC Shona Robison** is the Member of the Scottish Parliament for Dundee City East and presently serves as Cabinet Secretary for Health, Wellbeing and Sport in the Scottish Government.

Shona was first elected to represent Dundee East in 2003 having been a list MSP for the North East region since 1999. Since 2007 she served as Minister for Public Health and in 2009 was given the additional responsibility for Sport, with responsibility for the highly-successful Commonwealth Games in Glasgow in 2014.

In 2014 Shona was appointed Cabinet Secretary for Health, Wellbeing and Sport, one of the major briefs in Government, by the new First Minister Nicola Sturgeon.
